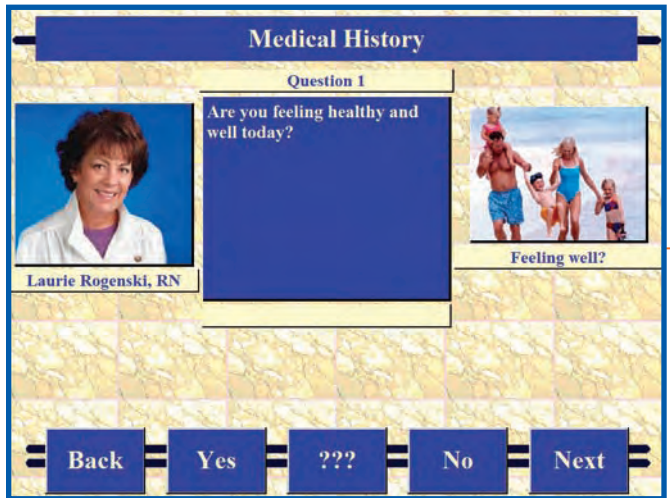

Internet Quality Donor System™

The **iQDS** process – from the donor perspective on **the day of donation**:

- **Sign-on**
- **Audio directions** given
- **Audiovisual** donor history questions are presented
- **Donor clicks** on appropriate response
- **When completed**, donor prints out anonymous bar-coded receipt
- **Donor registers** at the collection site as usual and presents bar-coded receipt
- **Donor must answer** 3 questions:
 - *Did you complete the interview yourself?*
 - *Were you in a private setting?*
 - *Have any of your responses changed, “e.g., risky sexual behavior or drug use?”*
- **Staff scans** bar-coded receipt, which recovers complete donor interview and responses
- **Staff reviews** interview responses
 - same as if donor had interviewed onsite






iQDS – walks the donor through the interview questions at a pace the donor chooses. The process is simple to use and understand.

iQDS – the bar-coded receipt

Privacy: *No identifying information requested or printed – bar-coded receipt is 100% anonymous*

iQDS: Internet Powered

Internet interview (iQDS)

Home or office: Donor self-interviews – donors complete donor history questionnaire from the privacy of their home or office

Less downtime: Donors spend less time away from home or office

Streamlines the donation process for the donor, donor group and your staff – a savings of over 10 minutes per donor

Bar-coded receipt printed that encodes interview and donor responses

Staff scans receipt to reconstitute interview and responses

Staff reviews donor responses

iQDS: Fast. Convenient. Safe. Happy Donors!

Audiovisual presentation: Easier for the donor to understand the self-interview – they hear and see the questions along with a picture

Donor friendly: More convenient for donor – less time away from school or work

Privacy: No identifying information requested or printed

Bar-coded receipt: Bar-coded receipt is 100% anonymous

No link to donor identity: iQDS has no link to donor identity until donor arrives at the collection location, registers and has receipt scanned

100% compliance: Receipt must be printed on the day of donation and must be unused

In our pilot studies, donors expressed a substantial preference for the internet screening interview that we expect will translate into improved donor satisfaction when fully implemented.”
